

9.5 LONGLY LONGBOW TOURNAMENT

Issue date: November 2024

The Southern Vales Archery Club (SVAC) Longly Longbow tournament will be governed by the following rules:

1. ELIGIBILITY

- 1.1 All competitors must be financial members of Archery Australia

2. DRESS CODE

- 2.1. Competitors are encouraged to wear medieval dress
- 2.2. All clothing worn must not contain any visible offensive, foul wording or graphics

3. FEES

- 3.1 Fees will be set each year by the Committee
- 3.2 Fees will not be refunded for any reason once the event has commenced
- 3.3 A BBQ dinner will be held immediately after the Tournament
- 3.4 Cost of the BBQ dinner for competitors will be included in the entry fee
- 3.5 Cost if the BBQ dinner for non-competitors will be listed in the entry form

4. BOW TYPES

- 4.1 The bow types permitted will be Longbow and unsighted Recurves
- 4.2 Sights are not permitted
- 4.3 Stabilisers and/or weights are not permitted

5. DIVISIONS

- 5.1. There are four Divisions, Senior Male, Senior Female, Junior Male (Under 18), and Junior Female (Under 18)

6. ROUNDS

- 6.1. Seniors will shoot an "averaged" Short Canberra 90 arrow round at 40m
- 6.2. Juniors will shoot an "averaged" Junior Canberra 90 arrow round at 30m
- 6.3. A ten minute break will occur between Ranges

7. SCORING

- 7.1. Scoring will be Off the Bow
- 7.2. Official Score Sheets must be used
- 7.3. Score sheets must be completed accurately and completely to be accepted
- 7.4. In the event of a tie, a count back on x's, then 10's, then 9's etc will apply
- 7.5. Competitors must complete 100% of the round for their scores to be accepted
- 7.6. Trophies will be awarded to 1st, 2nd and 3rd placegetters in all four Divisions immediately after the completion of the tournament, during the BBQ dinner
- 7.7. Winners of each Division will be added to the Longly Honour Board



8. EQUIPMENT FAILURE

- 8.1. In the event of an equipment failure, competitors will be given a maximum of fifteen minutes for repair and to re-enter the event
- 8.2. The shoot will continue with catch-up time allowed immediately after the completion of that particular end
- 8.3. In the event that the competitor is unable to re-join the shoot, Equipment Failure must be verified by the Field Captain, their score at the time of the equipment failure will be accepted as their final score for that event

9. INCLEMENT WEATHER

- 9.1. In the event of the weather being deemed “unshootable”, as determined by the Field Captain on the day, the event may be re-scheduled

10. SCHEDULE

- 10.1. Tournament is held on the last Sunday in November
- 10.2. Sign in by 1.00pm for a 1.30pm start
- 10.3. The Committee will communicate the date by a printed calendar displayed in the clubhouse and also via the website as soon as practicable after the first Committee Meeting for that financial year
- 10.4. The Committee will email the Entry Form to all South Australian affiliated Archery Club Secretaries before the end of August each year
